FROM OUR PAROCHIAL VICAR



If someone were to ask you the question: "What is the point of everything that you do at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Catholic Church?" What would you say? What is the point of everything that we do here? (Admittedly, there is a lot of good that is accomplished here!)

Certainly, as a priest I am moved by the generosity of this parish. People are involved. They are generous to the poor through our human concerns office. We give of ourselves admirably and to one another. We build up the Church, and we have numerous programs in which we go out and engage the community. For example, I think of the wonderful work that the Legion of Mary does when they visit the sick and the lonely. Certainly, people that

do such things should be encouraged by the words of Jesus Christ: "That which you did to the least of my brethren, you did unto me." Yet, this is not the center of the Christian life. To be quite honest, there are many social services and government programs that serve the community more effectively.

You don't have to be a Catholic to give to the poor and to feed the hungry. You don't have to be involved in religion to be a social worker. Many government programs have much more financial backing than we do here at Seton. That is not what distinguishes us as believers. There is something that we can give that no one else can give. We can give the life and love of Jesus Christ which ceaselessly gives itself to our fallen world by means of the Mass, the sacred liturgy.

Everything we do here at St Elizabeth Ann Seton is ultimately ordered to the Mass, so that others may come to encounter Jesus in the Eucharist through the sacred liturgy. This is why it is an incredible privilege to serve on the Holy Altar. It is the place where time and eternity intersect. The Eucharist is the Kiss of Jesus. Perhaps you've been listening to our announcements recently. In an effort to go back to having four servers at every Sunday Mass, we are inviting rising fifth grade boys and girls through high school to consider serving at Holy Mass which is nothing less than to worship Jesus as He makes the supreme sacrifice for us: the unbloody sacrifice of Calvary. We enter into it sacramentally, but we are there! St. John Marie Vianney said: "If we really understood the Mass, we would die of Joy." This is the point of everything we do here! *So, I ask you: "Will you consider serving? Will you be there on Calvary?"*

Archbishop Fulton Sheen once summed it up quite beautifully: "Picture then the High Priest Christ leaving the sacristy of Heaven for the altar of Calvary. He has already put on the vestments of our human nature, the maniple of our suffering, the stole of the priest, the chasuble of the cross. Calvary is His Cathedral; the rock of Calvary is the Altar stone; the sun turning red is the sanctuary lamp; Mary and John are the living side alters; the host His Body; the wine is His Blood. He is upright as a priest, yet He is prostrate as a victim. His Mass is about to begin."

WEEKLY REFLECTION

CONTENT WITH GOD'S WILL

When you love, you aren't unhappy. If we believe and we love, we can always rejoice in the loving presence of the Father, who in all situations exhorts us to confirm his plan of love in our lives.

A Christian life is one great confirmation. But you can take another step. If everything in your life is part of God's plan, then everything is good, and you can thank God for everything.

We often behave oddly when it comes to thinking God. We divide things into two categories. There are things for which we thank God, namely that which satisfies our senses, our common sense, our wishes. Another category – that which we experience as unpleasant and difficult – we ask God to change as soon as possible.

When we wake up to bright sunshine, we say: Thank you, gracious God! But if it rains on the day which we have planned a picnic, we become displeased with God and feel that he lets us down.

We should obviously thank God for the good he bestows on us. But it is wrong not to thank him, even when things go against us. Our discontent implies that we think we know better than God what is best for us. We accuse God of mismanaging everything.

God loves you much more than you love yourself, and he is infinitely more capable than you are to judge what is best for you. There really is reason to thank him in and through everything.

STATEMENT OF THE BISHOPS OF THE PROVINCE OF BALTIMORE AND THE ARCHDIOCESE OF WASHINGTON

*Lifting the General Dispensation from the
Obligation to Attend Mass*

We, the Catholic Bishops of the Province of Baltimore and the Archdiocese of Washington, give thanks to Almighty God for the progress our country has made in curbing the coronavirus pandemic. The average number of new cases of COVID-19 continues to decline due to the observance of safety protocols and the increase of the availability of the vaccine. At this time, many places in our region are enjoying a return to some sense of normalcy.

Therefore, we are lifting the dispensation of the Sunday and Holy Days Mass obligation in the Archdiocese of Baltimore, the Archdiocese of Washington, and the Dioceses of Arlington, Richmond, Wheeling-Charleston, and Wilmington and reinstating that obligation beginning on Saturday, June 26, 2021 and Sunday, June 27, 2021.

We welcome and encourage the Faithful to return to full in-person participation of the Sunday Eucharist, the source and summit of our Catholic faith (cf. Code of Canon Law, canon 1246-1247 and Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 2180).

This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus, another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility; or those with serious underlying health conditions. One should consult his or her local pastor if questions arise about the obligation to attend Mass (Canon 1245 and the Catechism of the Catholic Church n. 2181).

Safety protocols and other liturgical directives in each diocese remain in effect until modified or revoked by the respective Diocesan Bishop.

Let us continue to be united in prayer for one another and for an end to the global pandemic.

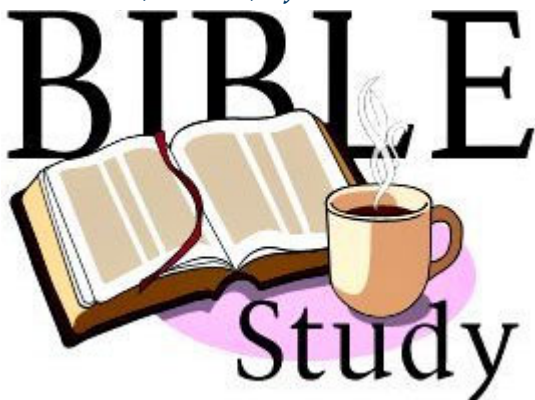

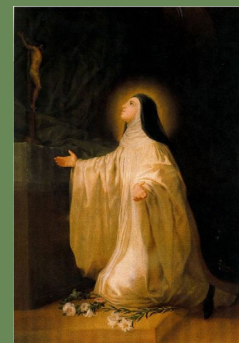

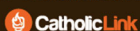

WHAT IS VESPERS?

Evening Prayer (also called Vespers) is part of the Liturgy of the Hours, also known as the Divine Office. In the Liturgy of the Hours, the Church fulfills Jesus' command to "pray always" (Luke 18:1; see also 1 Thessalonians 5:17). Through this prayer, the people of God sanctify the day by continual praise of God and prayers of intercession for the needs of the world.

The Liturgy of the Hours includes several specified times of prayer. The most important times, called the "hinge hours," are Morning Prayer (which takes place upon rising) and Evening Prayer (which takes place as dusk begins to fall). Evening Prayer gives thanks for the day just past and makes an evening sacrifice of praise to God (see *Psalm 141:1*).

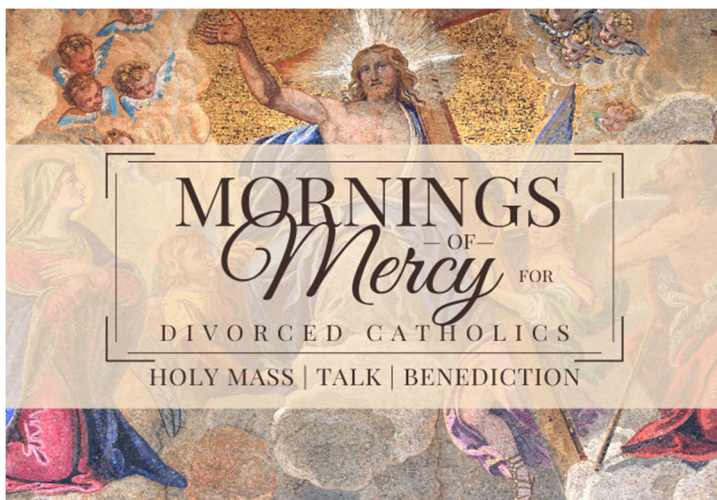
At Evening Prayer, those assembled sing or recite the Canticle of Mary, also called the *Magnificat* after the first word in the Latin text of this prayer. This Canticle is treated with the reverence given to the reading of the Gospel at Mass. It is

introduced with an antiphon and the Sign of the Cross and it concludes with a doxology of praise and the repeating of the antiphon. At celebrations of particular solemnity, it may be accompanied by incense.

The scapular

is a cloth that hangs over the shoulders, covering the chest and back, it represents work and being a handmaid of the Lord.

The Brown Scapular is a Roman Catholic devotion to Mary under her title of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, and in her role as the patroness of the Carmelite Order.

The scapular is a reflection in miniature of the Carmelite habit, and made of the same material. When worn, it becomes a "small sign of the great ideal of Carmel: intimacy with God and friendship among the disciples".

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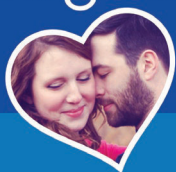


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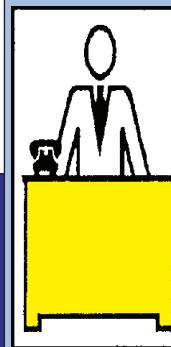
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
