FROM OUR DEACON



In last week's Gospel, Jesus quieted the storm upon request. In today's Gospel, Jesus raises a young girl from the dead at her father's pleading, and then a woman is cured of hemorrhages just by touching Jesus. These are wonderful examples of Jesus' many miracles, but it begs the questions: "Why don't such miracles occur whenever someone with faith makes a desperate plea to Jesus for help? Why does God often at times refuse what we ask for, even when we do so in His name?"

Miracles DO occur, but you may not have directly experienced one, despite asking for one. Does that mean your faith is not strong enough? No. The truth is, we may not know the reason for much of the suffering we see or experience. We won't know the answers to so many questions until we meet Jesus face-to-face. This is often difficult because we expect immediate results. And if we don't get the results we want when we want them, we demand an explanation. And if no good explanation is forthcoming, our faith is shaken or lost completely.

It is certain that Jesus' life also had many difficulties. God does not try to trick us into believing otherwise. He is upfront and honest about suffering. In this life, it is clear that there is no guarantee that all will work out the way we want or hope. One of the only guarantees is that this life will end at some point. It is very temporary.

There is also another guarantee. That for those of us who have faith, this life is not the end, but a beginning. That is so important to remember. Where we are now is not our final destination. We are on our way there and Jesus is accompanying us on that journey. He does not abandon us in our suffering. He is with us always.



Difficulties and suffering can help us see things more clearly, to get perspective, to learn what is important from what is trivial. We often forget our blessings, but choose instead to focus on that over which we have little-to-no control and which really doesn't matter all that much. But be assured that although difficulties will come, Christ is with us always and looks forward to carrying us through difficult times to lead us to our true destination, to our true home – which is in Heaven.

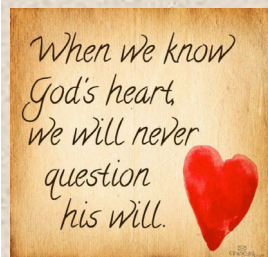
Greater Signs

The Gospel tells us that Jesus cures the sick. Many may wonder why he doesn't do so today, why there are so few wonders these days. But Jesus does more and greater wonders now than when He visibly walked the earth.

When Jesus cures the blind, the deaf, and the lame it is only a humble beginning. The important healing comes later. He begins with the exterior, but little by little He makes his way deeper into the inner person.

To cure a body is a sign of something else to follow. No one grasped this better than John the Evangelist. He doesn't speak of "wonders," but about "signs." "The one who believes in Me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these," Jesus says (Jn 14:12). These "greater" signs are seen in the sacraments.

How can the miracle in Cana or the wonder of feeding the crowd compare with the Eucharist? What is it to be cured of paralysis when compared to being able to hear these words: "I absolve you of all your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit"?



It is primarily the sacraments that communicate God's healing and saving power to us. To be sure, Jesus can cure bodily diseases even in our day. Furthermore, the healing power of the sacraments often has a rejuvenating impact on the body. But bodily health is not the essential. The greatest cure takes place when we, in our hearts, open ourselves to God's own life.

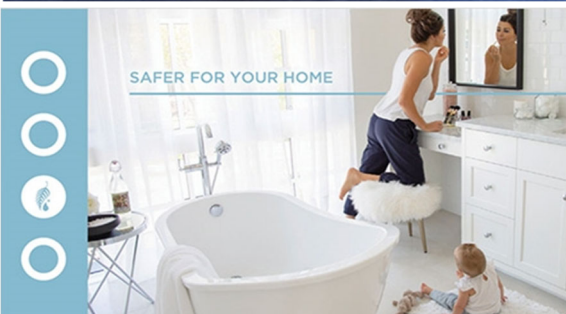

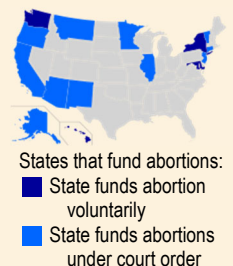
Congress is trying to take away the pro-life Hyde Amendment and thereby force Americans to pay for abortion.
