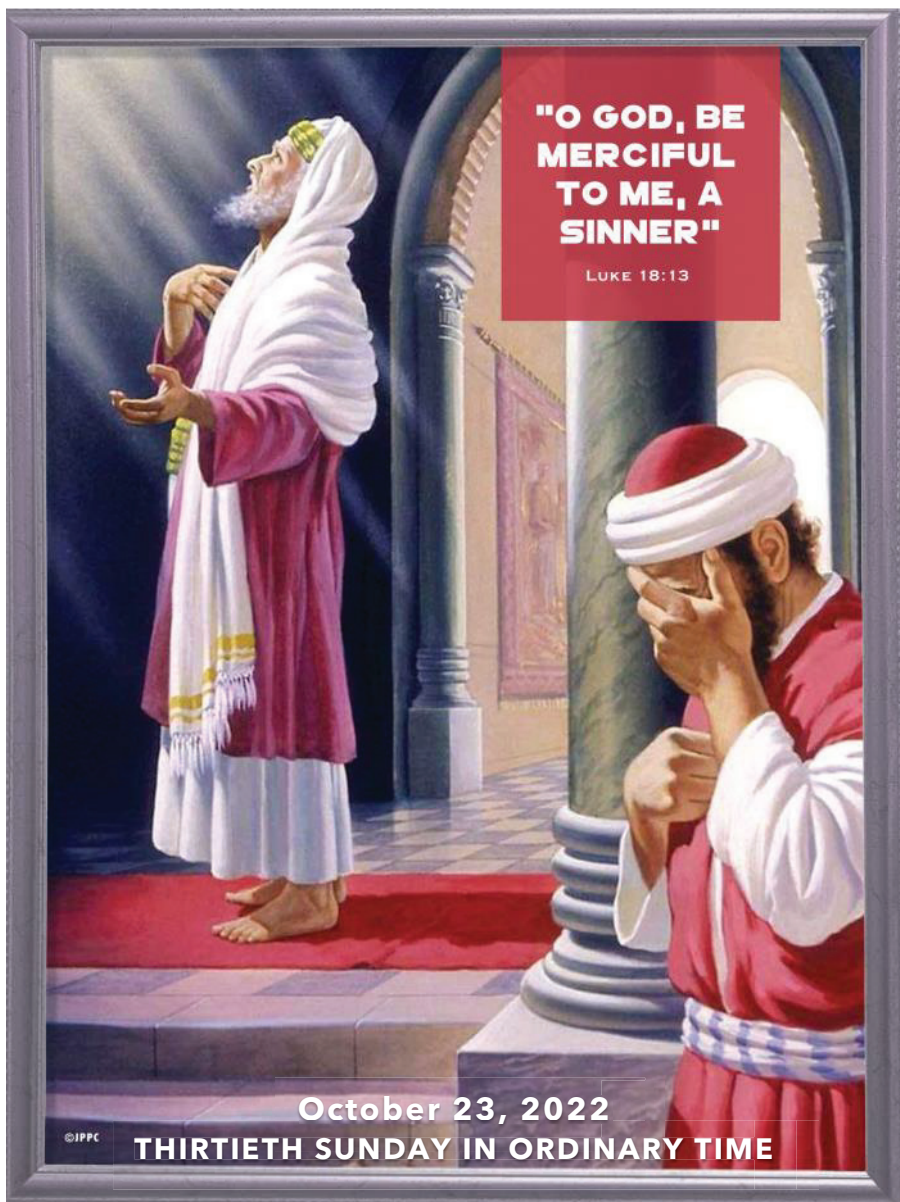

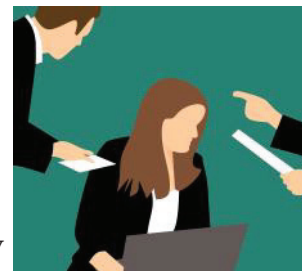

FROM OUR DEACON



In today's Gospel, Jesus warns us of the dangers of religious pride. The parable describes a Pharisee who thanks God for making him so good and righteous, not at all like the sinful tax collector, the other character in the parable. In contrast, the tax collector is so aware and ashamed of his sin that he refuses even to approach God. Unlike the Pharisee, the tax collector acknowledges his sinfulness and feels shame as a result. The Pharisee demonstrates pride and arrogance while the tax collector offers a lesson in humility and contrition.

If this sounds familiar, it may be because sometimes we may not act much differently than the Pharisee. (I very much include myself when I refer to the collective "we.") For those of us who attend Mass regularly and make an effort to practice our faith, it is not uncommon for some of us to look down on those so-called "lapsed" Catholics who come to Mass only on Holy Days of obligation. Even those of us who profess to support all teachings of the Church, especially the Church's teaching on the sanctity of life at all stages, can be quick to judge those who actively oppose Church teaching on this, and other, important issues. Although our judgment may be accurate, Jesus warns us that as we judge, we too will be judged and with the same measure, it will be applied to us.



When we judge others, we exalt ourselves and are guilty of the sin of pride. It doesn't take only serious sins like murder, theft or adultery to separate us from God. The more common, seemingly "harmless" sins of vanity, envy, or pride can also cause our downfall. If we ever find ourselves feeling more holy than others because we make an effort to live our faith, we should not credit ourselves but instead give thanks to God for the gift of our faith, and pray for those who have little or none. And if we ever find ourselves looking down on others because of their sins, we must remind ourselves that the sins that should horrify each of us the most are the ones committed by the person we see in the mirror every day.



WEEKLY REFLECTION

Don't Ask For Nonessentials

The most essential thing we should pray for is that God's kingdom may come, that is, that God may become a reality to us.

Why are we to pray for that, since we already believe in God's existence? But believing in God's existence doesn't necessarily mean that God is real to us. If you want to know whether God is truly real to you, ask yourself a few concrete questions. In what do I find my joy? What makes me sad? What am I afraid of? What do I long for? If

you can answer that your joy is in God, that your greatest sorrow is not to live even more in his love, that what frightens you the most is the thought of not being faithful to him, that your longing is that his love may fill everything and everyone – yes, then God is real to you.

But how many can honestly answer in this way? Christianity is often an external matter rather than an internal one. A God whom we think of and whose existence we affirm, but who really doesn't affect us in the core of our being, such a God is an abstraction. This is not the way God's kingdom is formed in us.

Jesus has entreated us to pray always and not to lose heart (Lk 18:1). This exhortation has to be about something more essential than asking for money, food, health. It is for God's very self we are counseled to pray.
