

FROM OUR DEACON



In today's gospel, Jesus uses the Parable of the Talents to urge us to be ready for the master's return. Jesus is that master who went on a journey when He ascended to heaven. After a long time, the master, Jesus, will return. This will be either the moment of our death or His Second Coming. At that time --whichever comes first--we will stand before Him with our talents and provide an account of what we have done with what He gave us.

It is important to note that the talents were not distributed to each servant equally in the parable. One servant received five talents, one received two talents, and one servant received one talent. Jesus said they were distributed to each according to his ability. Although the first two

servants produced a different number of talents, the master said exactly the same thing to the servant who produced five talents as to the one who produced two talents,

"Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities. Come, share your master's joy."

There is not even one word different in the master's response to the servants even though one had produced three talents more than the other. Why? The reward they receive is equal because each produced the most he could according to his ability. Each one did his best with what he was given.

The third servant, however, did not even try. He was wicked and lazy. He did nothing and suffered the consequences. It wasn't that he was terribly immoral; his sins were sins of omission rather than sins of commission. It was what he should have done and did not that was his sin. Like the other two, he also received a talent according to his ability. Even though he was given less, he could have been expected to have made at least one talent, but he didn't even try. Instead, he took the safe and easy route and made no progress to show his master at His return.

This is a good lesson for us. Now is the time to discern if we are either good and faithful servants or wicked and lazy servants. The Lord does not give us a blueprint for every hour of every day just as the servants in the parable were not told what to do with their talents. But the Lord expects us to use wisely the gifts He has given us. Through prayer, we have to ask God how we can best use the gift we have received. We are not expected to produce the same fruit as our neighbor, but we are expected to produce fruit for the kingdom. God expects us to be enterprising and entrepreneurial for Him. We are not to waste our time and abilities pursuing only comfort and security. Comfort is very nice and security is important, but when our lives become nothing more than a pursuit of finding ways to sit back, relax and do nothing, we are wasting what God has given us.

We have received so much from God that we take for granted. If, we have buried a talent, now is the time to dig it up and put it to God's good use so that when we meet our Lord face to face, we can hear Him say to us, "Well done, my good and faithful servant. Come, share your master's joy."

WEEKLY REFLECTION

Answers From Life

Someone asked Jesus: "Lord, will only a few be saved?" (Lk 13:23). Most of the pharisees believed that all of Israel would be saved. But certain apocalyptic circles were less optimistic and believed that only a small remnant would avoid judgement to come. Down through the ages, people have asked themselves this same question.

"Strive," Jesus says, "to enter through the narrow door." He doesn't respond to the question about who and how many. Our interest in statistics is completely foreign to him. The only thing important is life. "Make sure that you yourself – indeed all of you who listen to me – is on board. Do not waste your time with theories and deliberations. Start to live! Get going! Strive to enter through the narrow door." Eternal Bliss is a matter for discussion; it is the fruit of a struggle which each one of us must wrestle with *now*.

Life is too short to give us answers to all our questions. You have been given your time to live life. In Christianity, life comes before any speculation about it. And this life is extremely simple. Love God and your neighbors; that is what it all comes down to.

Experience shows that the one who lives this way, in love, will eventually receive answers to his or her questions. The answers grow out of life itself.


