FROM OUR DEACON



Holy Mass is the greatest act of worship that we, as human beings, can give to God. No matter how many other prayers we offer or whatever praise we give to God, nothing compares in any sense to the

value and the power of the Mass. The Mass is God's plan for our worship of Him. It is during the Mass that God the Son, through the power of the Holy Spirit, offers to God the Father the perfect sacrifice of His very Self. Nothing human can possibly match this. It is during the Mass that the Lord Jesus feeds us with His Body and Blood: no mere symbol, but the reality of His Presence,

not bread and wine in any sense other than their appearance, once those simple elements have been consecrated, but His true flesh, His true blood, His soul, and His divinity. Through the power of the same Holy Spirit who brought all things into existence out of nothing, the humble of offerings of bread and wine become God Himself. This is what we believe as Catholics. We believe that the Holy Eucharist is Jesus, not a thing, not a symbol, not a sign, but God, the true God, the living God.

For this reason, this Holy Eucharist is deserving of our greatest respect and our deepest devotion. We show the Eucharistic Jesus the most profound reverence and care, we kneel and bow before Him, we respect silence and prayerfulness in His presence. While there is a loving familiarity on our part in regard to His Eucharistic Presence, we must avoid at all costs a casual attitude to this Sacrament because it is here, in the Holy Eucharist, in the celebration of the Mass, in the reception of Holy Communion, that God has chosen to unite Himself to us, to enter into us, to become one with us.



In the Mass, He gives us a foretaste of what we hope to have in Heaven for ever.

But the exchange is not to be one-sided. As God gives Himself to us there is an expectation, on His part, that we too will give ourselves to Him, that we will offer our lives to Him just as He has offered His life for us. It is in receiving Him in



Holy Communion and drawing from this holy Sacrament all graces possible, that we are enabled to do this. In giving Himself to us, Jesus gives us all we require to be able to give ourselves back to Him in return and to live for Him above all things. As God transforms bread and wine into Himself, so in receiving Holy Communion He offers us the possibility of being transformed into Him too. Today we honor the Blessed Sacrament, the Body and Blood of the Lord in this Feast of Corpus Christi, but as Catholics, that honor, that love, that desire for intimacy with the Eucharistic Jesus is something to be nurtured each day of our lives, especially through Holy Mass.

WEEKLY REFLECTION

Without Spirit the Letter is Dead

The Christian tradition has always held that the text of the Bible has both a literal and a spiritual meaning.

In the Book of Revelation, John speaks about a scroll written both in the front and the back (5:1). The Vulgate translates this: "scpritum intus et foris" - written in full, inside and out. The tradition has recognized the Bible in this scroll. On the back - or outside - the text is written according to the Spirit. To truly understand the text, one must go from the outside to the inside.

When you read God's word, don't satisfy yourself with the literal meaning, but seek also the spiritual. This spiritual meaning is not something arbitrary that you read into the text based on your own comprehension; it has a structure, its own objectives grounding. It isn't separated from the letter, but less hidden in it.

The literal meaning is good and indispensable, since it is what takes you to the spiritual meaning. The letter is the tool and servant of the spirit. But if you don't reach the spiritual meaning, you are reading the Scriptures without comprehension. Remember the Ethiopian court official (Acts 8:30-31). That which the Bible — the Old Testament — recounts, which often deals with historical facts, is not a completed reality; on the contrary, it is dynamic, open, and alive. In various texts of the Bible, God is not about to lead you away from the historical reality, but into the center of reality.


