FROM OUR SUMMER SEMINARIAN



Hello St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish, peace and joy to you all. I want to introduce myself to those who I might not have met yet. My name is Paul Rhee, a seminarian of this Diocese, and I have been assigned to Seton Lake Ridge for the summer. A little about myself, I was born in Annandale and went to St. Michael Catholic School from K-3rd and in 2009 my family moved to Vienna. I switched to Fairfax County Public School (FCPS) for the rest of my time until my graduation in 2019 and after this, I went to Virginia Tech for my freshman year. The Lord, however, had different plans and I transferred into the college seminary the following year. I attended St. John Paul II Seminary in Washington, D.C. to study philosophy and graduated in 2023. I then started my theology studies at Mount St. Mary's

Seminary in Emmitsburg, MD. I will be ordained a deacon in two years and a priest six months afterwards. What really brought on the path towards the priesthood was the power of prayer and the many holy priests that I met in my life. I am happy to be with you all this summer.

Please feel free to say hi and introduce yourself after Mass or at any point this summer when you see me. Know of my prayers for you all, and please pray for me as I journey towards the priesthood of our Lord.

What influenced your decision to apply for seminary entrance?

A powerful confession during my freshman year of high school really made me realize the importance of God and faith and how I needed to put them first in my life. This event led to daily prayer, which, combined with good holy priests who became my spiritual directors, lead to recognizing a desire for the priesthood that the Lord put into my heart. After almost five years of discernment, the seminary and the priesthood became something that I could not put off. I needed to try it out.

What advice would you give to a young man thinking about seminary?

Pray and be around holy priests, particularly get a spiritual director who is right for you. Without prayer a person cannot listen and spend time with God because He speaks a lot to us in prayer. We just need to be open and listen. Being around holy priests helps a person see the life and genuineness of what a priest of Jesus Christ is supposed to be. Lastly, don't be afraid. Doing the will of God is the greatest adventure there is.

WEEKLY REFLECTION

Chaos Without God

The Bible gives many examples of how existentially destructive it is when human kind doesn't let God be God. The story of Babel is one: "Come, let us build ourselves a city, and a tower with its top in the heavens, and let us make a name for ourselves." (Gen 11:4).

The tower reaching to the heavens is an expression of the human will to be on the same level as God. We don't want to be dependent on God any longer. We want to make a name for ourselves, and we will not let God rule our lives. The result is chaos. People can no longer communicate and don't understand the languages of one another.

The point of the story of the tower of Babel is to show the fundamental connection between our mutual relations and our relation to God. When we break our relationship with God, we also break our relationship with one another.

If God is not given His right place in your life, you will lose your true name, the name of God knows you by. You lose your identity. If your personhood is not rooted in the authentic love that comes from God, you will not be able to meet others in a genuine way.

When people live without God, they become strangers to one another, and techniques have been developed to help us hide ourselves and not show our true selves. We become evermore locked up in our narrow bunkers.

We need God to be able to truly communicate. When we know we are loved by him, we can confidentially open up ourselves to one another.

EXPLORE YOUR VOCATION, DON'T JUST DISCERN IT

From the Diocese of Arlington

When our modern ears hear the word "discern" we think of its modern definition to see, perceive or distinguish; but in Latin "*discernere*" literally means to separate, set apart, or divide. The Latin is more active than what we normally think of as discernment. Therefore, rather than simply discerning your vocation (seeking to know the answer), instead try *exploring* your vocation. When you explore something you are active, not passive. When you explore something you don't quite know what you are going to encounter; this is why we explore. Finally, when you explore something there is no expectation that you will get it right the first time.

Priestly formation actually begins in the family, continues through the discernment process, is solidified during seminary years of study and pastoral experience, and is confirmed at ordination, where it becomes a lifetime of collaboration with God's grace and human effort. Becoming a priest means taking one's mere human, mortal, sinful state, uniting it with God's grace and one's own effort, and witnessing the transformation into an alter Christus, which is Latin for "other Christ."

The priest is an "*alter Christus*" which is Latin for another Christ. He is called to be a witness of Christ to the flock that has been entrusted to him as their shepherd. He is a minister of the sacraments, proclaimer of the word, teacher of the faith, and steward of the Church. The priest is meant to accompany and lead the flock entrusted to his care through this world in such a way as they are able to reach the eternal kingdom of heaven.

General Qualifications for Acceptance to the Priesthood

Baptized, confirmed and practicing Roman Catholic men with a desire to serve God and His people as a priest must possess the following general qualifications:

- Faith in, and love for, Christ and His Church.
- Good moral character.
- A high school diploma with favorable academic abilities.
- Emotional balance and maturity.
- Good physical health.
- Psychological readiness and capacity to pursue a sustaining, life-long commitment.
- A deepening habit of prayer and a balanced devotional life.
- Maturity to recognize and the willingness to respond to the needs of others.
- Readiness to serve in the manner to which he is called by God, through his Bishop.
- A developing spirit of detachment that helps him be in the world but not of the world.
- Freedom to enter this state in life.

In addition to the *general* qualifications above, a candidate for the Diocese of Arlington must also meet the following criteria:

- Be between the ages of 17-45. (Rare exceptions are considered on a case by case basis)
- Have a connection and familiarity with the Diocese of Arlington and the people with whom the candidate feels called to serve here as a future priest, i.e. by living (past or present), working or studying within the diocese for at least two years. (In circumstances of military families exception can be made.)
