## FROM OUR PAROCHIAL VICAR



An important part of our Bible, which we may not always appreciate, is the Book of Psalms. St. Ambrose (339-397), Bishop of Milan, wrote a beautiful introduction to his <u>Explanation of the</u> <u>Psalms</u>.

"Though all Scripture is fragrant with God's grace, the Book of Psalms has a special attractiveness.

"Moses wrote the history of Israel's forefathers in prose, but after leading the people through the Red Sea – a wonder that remained in their memory – he broke into a song of triumph in praise of

God when he saw King Pharaoh drowned along with his forces (cf. Ex 15:1-18). His genius soared to a higher level, to match an accomplishment beyond his own powers.

"Miriam, too, raised her timbrel and sang encouragement for the rest of the women, saying: '*Sing to the Lord, for he is gloriously triumphant; horse and chariot he has cast into the sea*' (ex 15:21b).

"In the Book of Psalms, there is profit for all, with healing power for our salvation. There is instruction from history, teaching from the law, prediction from prophecy, chastisement from denunciation, persuasion from moral preaching. All who read it may find the cure for their own individual failings. All with eyes to see can discover in it a complete gymnasium for the soul, a stadium for all the virtues, equipped for every kind of exercise; it is for each to choose the kind he judges best to help him gain the prize.

"If you wish to read and imitate the deeds of the past, you will find the whole history of the Israelites in a single psalm: in one short reading, you can amass a treasure for the memory. If you want to study the power of the law, which is summed up in the bond of charity (*'the one who loves another has fulfilled the law*,' Rom 13:8c), you may read in the psalms of the great love with which one man faced serious dangers singlehandedly in order to remove the shame of the whole people. You will find the glory of charity more than a match for the parade of power.

"What am I to say of the grace of prophecy? We see that what others hinted at in riddles was promised openly and clearly to the psalmist alone: the Lord Jesus was to be born of his seed, according to the word of the Lord, 'Your own offspring I will set upon your throne' (Ps 132:11c).

"In the psalms, then, not only is Jesus born for us, he also undergoes his saving passion in his body, he lies in death, he rises again, he ascends into heaven, he sits at the right hand of the Father. What no man would have dared to say was foretold by the psalmist alone, and afterward proclaimed by the Lord himself in the Gospel."

## WEEKLY REFLECTION

## **Mary Mediates Security**

As the mother of God and all of humanity, Mary radiates a security that is capable of conquering all fear.

The Gospel teaches us something about this secrets that so deeply anchored Mary in a divine security that she is able to pass onto us.

"But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart" (Lk 2:19). Mary was probably often perplexed about what happened in her life and in the life of her son. But she took it all to her heart. Luke says nothing about *how* she pondered the various incidents. But we can get a feel for it when we see the results: her song of praise. "My soul magnifies the Lord," she sings (Lk 1:46).

Mary's song is one of thanksgiving for all the great things God does in her life. Her "pondering" consists in letting the events enter her heart and there be transformed into praise and thanksgiving. In her heart, everything falls into its right place, everything is given a meaning; there she sees how everything come from the hand of God, and how God, in the midst of all that she doesn't understand, does great things for her.

If you learn from Mary to see everything in a larger perspective, as a sign of the Father's care and love, then — in the midst of the unrest of the world — you will be filled with divine security and peace.
