

FROM OUR DEACON



In today's Gospel, Jesus asks His disciples, "who do you say that I am?" At this moment Peter proclaims that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God. Jesus then declares Peter blessed, not because of any great act on Peter's part, but because the Father chose to reveal this most information to him.

For a simple fisherman, Peter is a complicated character. He's our first pope, but he is clearly a very flawed individual. It seems odd that the man who would make the bold proclamation expressed in today's Gospel would be the same man who would deny Jesus in his hour of greatest need. There is no doubt that when Peter proclaims Jesus is the son of God, he believes every word of it. Yet, when it really counted, Peter turned away from Jesus to save himself.

When we sin, we too turn away from Jesus and toward ourselves. Of course, we don't deny Jesus outwardly as Peter did, but we do it in more subtle ways. I've noticed that we often do it by our silence, by not speaking up for the truth of the Gospel when we have an opportunity. I've remained silent at times when I probably shouldn't have and I bet many of you have as well. Maybe we don't speak up because we don't want to create uncomfortable situations in our workplaces, our schools, with friends, or even in our homes. We prefer peace and comfort no matter the price. In so doing, we are acting much like Peter did when confronted in the courtyard the night of Jesus' trial. We deny Him.

Today's Gospel presents us with an opportunity to answer the same question Jesus asked his disciples—who do you say that Jesus is? Assuming you believe Jesus to be the messiah, the Son of God, the questions is—does your life reflect that belief? In what direction is your life heading? Are you on the road to Christ, headed away from Him, or simply standing there waiting for Jesus to do the work? I would venture that for many of us, we are neither moving toward Christ nor moving away from Him but rather are just standing there, watching time pass by. Jesus has called us to do more than stand idly by.

When I think of what direction we are headed, I am reminded of the tradition of the encounter between Jesus and Peter outside of Rome. As legend has it, Peter decided to flee Rome at the outbreak of the persecution, perhaps in fear, perhaps because he thought he should be somewhere safe so others could eventually find him. Just outside of Rome, Peter meets Jesus, who is heading into the city of Rome to face the persecution. "Quo vadis, Domine," Peter asks – "Lord, where are you going?" "I am going to Rome to be crucified," Jesus answers – and disappears. At this point, Peter turns back into the city to embrace martyrdom. Instead of saving himself and denying Jesus again, he turns away from himself and toward Jesus.

Although it is unlikely that any of us will be called to martyrdom, we are all called to turn away from ourselves and toward Jesus. So...if you honestly believe that Jesus is the Christ, the son of the Living God, my question to you (and me) is the same one Peter asked Jesus outside of Rome—"Where are You going?"

WEEKLY REFLECTION

Harmony With God

John writes in his first letter: "And this is the boldness we have in him, that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us" (5:14). Rather than coming from a sincere wish to do God's will, prayer often has its roots in egoism. Not until you thank God with all your heart do you step out of yourself and become united with God's will. From the perspective of his will you can then see more clearly what you are to ask. Then you will be certain that your prayer will be answered. "We receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him. (1 Jn 3:22).



If you constantly praise and give thanks to God in all that happens, then you live in harmony with him, which means that you won't be asking for anything that doesn't harmonize with God's will. God will then recognize in you his own Spirit who "intercedes for the saints according to the will of God" (Rom 8:27).

The earliest Christians didn't live in circumstances more conductive than ours. They suffered severe persecutions. To profess Christ carried a constant a constant risk of losing one's life. Yet Paul wrote to them: "Sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, singing and making melody to the Lord in your hearts, giving thanks to God the Father at all times and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Eph 5:19-20).

When you turn your gaze on God you will gain insight into what is best for you and for all.




LIVING

Saint Augustine of Hippo, Bishop & Doctor of the Church

St. Augustine, before he came to the faith lived a life of heresy. His mother, St. Monica, spent tearful decades hoping he would one day return to the faith. St. Ambrose told St. Monica, ' child of so many tears cannot be lost." Earlier in St. Augustine's life he had a son out of wedlock and then at the age of 31, he heard a childlike voice telling him, "Take up and read; take up and read." After this St. Augustine began to read the bible and study the faith. A year later Augustine and his son were both baptized into the faith. Once his mother and son died he gave all of the family fortune to the poor. Augustine was ordained a priest and in 395 he became bishop of Hippo. During this time he wrote more than 100 works of theology, apologetics, and philosophy. St.

Augustine's life is one for reflection because no matter how



far it seems like we are away from God, he always calls us back to

him.




